## Art and Technology on View at HKUST

Exponential developments in information technology have not only changed people's lives but also created new art forms.

Video Circle II--Contemporary Video & Media Art, to be held at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology from 16 July-9 August, features a media circle with more than 20 multimedia works created on CD-ROM and video by German artists. Visitors are invited to interact with the artists' works through screen-touching and game-playing.

The exhibition also features a video circle consisting of 20 television sets showing the same series of images in a synchronized fashion. The first image reappears in the last TV set a minute later because of a time delay of three seconds. The video circle was created by local artists Winnie Fu, Jamsen Law, Keith Lee, Lo Yee Fong, Ng Yin Chun, Tony Yung Tak Wai, and the art group Anachronism.

The exhibition is presented by HKUST's Center for the Arts, co-organized by Videotage and Zuni Icosahedron, and supported by the Hong Kong Arts Development Council. It is the second in a series of Video Circle exhibitions that began in October 1996.
